As milk and honey are sweet to the taste, so are the words of the Torah sweet to the soul.

It is a tree of life to all who hold it fast, and all who cling to it find happiness. Its ways are ways of pleasantness and all its paths are peace.

When the Festival begins on the Sabbath, begin here:

On Sukkot, when the Kiddush is recited in the Sukkah, add these blessings:

For the waving of the lulav:

Responsive Reading The Lulav and the Etrog

Earth and sky, rain and sun, flower and fruit speak to us of God's creative power.

Like generations before us, we give thanks for God's goodness to us.

Into our sanctuary, we have brought the symbols of Sukkot: The lulav, the palm, that resembles the human spine, to remind us that we must stand straight with courage and integrity.

May we aspire to serve God by standing up for justice, truth and peace.

The myrtle, whose leaves are shaped like eyes with which to behold the grandeur and beauty of our world.

May we learn to serve God more fully by looking with kindness and compassion upon every living being.

The willow of the brook, whose leaves are shaped like human lips.

May our lips sing God's praise and bless all the children of the Eternal One.

The etrog, shaped like the human heart: May we remember that love is the doorway through which we may pass from self-centeredness to service, and from isolation to kinship with all the world.

God of all people and of all the world, with palm and myrtle, willow and etrog, with spine and eyes, with lips and heart, we praise You.
